Center gets equipment

Farmington Area Community Women gave a gift of money to buy play equipment for physically impaired youngsters who come to Alameda Early Childhood Center. With matching funds from the center, a new ball pit has been purchased.

The pit, which allows young children to float in a sea of light-weight balls, provides physical movement and sensory stimulation appropriate for all children.

The money from FAGW for the purchase came from its BUBS (Buckle Up Babies for Safety) project, which offers parents the opportunity to rent, rather than buy, infant and toddler car seats.

Profits from the rentals are disbursed to organizations or agencies, after a committee review of needs brought to the members' attention. This year the majority of the rental profits were given for the play equipment.
