Plan Tea

Two women, both active in Livonia Republican politics and with PTA groups, are forming a ladies volunteer group to "elect Carl D. Pursell our state senator."

Pursell is a Wayne County commissioner from a district that includes Livonia and Plymouth.

Family 'Y' Blazes Summer Trails

Livonia's Family "Y" branch of the Metropolitan YMCA, will reach out in all directions this summer, from swim classes in backyard pools to trailblazing in Canada, and from babies to family groups.

Sixteen pools will be used each week in the Y's program of teaching persons to swim. Non-members who live in the areas of selected pools are invited to register at the Livonia Y, 14255 Stark, June 18 and 17. There will be two sessions running for four weeks, two days a week. Cost of the lessons is \$10, with classes beginning the week of June 29.

An extensive program for teenagers includes two canoeing trips in Canada for junior and senior high school boys. The first will run from July 27 to Aug. 22 at a cost of \$250. The second will be from Aug. 10 to 22 and will cost \$150.

THE BABIES, six months and up, will be taught to swim in pre-school classes, and families will enjoy recessed use of Y facilities in a new Sunday "open house" policy.

Those who want to avoid the long hot Sunday drive to the

beach will be able to plan their activities around the new program. All of the facilities, swimming pool, gymnasium, handball courts and health clubs will be available for family use from 2 to 5 p.m., beginning June 14.

There will be no charge to family members of the Y, but community members or guests will be charged \$3 per family. Adjoining park facilities may be used for picnic lunches.

Family groups are also invited to attend weekend tent and trailer campouts at Camp Ohivesa, 40 minutes from Livonia, July 11 to 13, July 25 to 27, Aug. 8 to 10, and Aug. 22 to 25. Swimming, boating, archery and other camp facilities will be put to use.

The program for teenagers will open in June with "teenage garage," an automobile mechanics course for junior high boys at the Sinclair gasoline station, Schoolcraft and Eckles. The project is shared by the Y, Optimist Club juvenile division and Livonia school shop teachers.

BOTH BOYS and girls in junior and senior high school are invited to sign up for an

Au Sable River trip from June 22 to 27, for \$45. Boys and girls 14 to 18 may spend July 27 to Aug. 10 backpacking on Isle Royal.

Seventh to ninth-grade boys and girls will be able to go canoe camping in Michigan, stopping at state parks and Y camps, Aug. 8 to 14, at a cost of \$68. Stay-at-homeers may participate in branch caravan visits, evening trips to other Detroit YMCAs for a variety of teenage activities, or take teen and young adult yoga at the Y every Sunday afternoon.

As usual, the Y will operate two summer camps, Ohivesa for eight to 11-year-olds, and Nissokane for 12 to 17-year-olds. There will also be a day camp, beginning June 29.

If enough interest is shown, a YMAA high school basketball league will be run during the summer. Games will be played every Wednesday from 7 to 9 p.m.

Other activities for the

summer will include pre-school swim classes, gymnastics and tennis lessons. The pre-school swim sessions will be held for youngsters between the ages of six months and five years, with registration set for the week of June 8. Two sessions will run Tuesday and Thursday mornings for four weeks.

This summer's swimming program will be under the direction of Jeannette Wheeler, new women's and girls' director. Miss Wheeler is a June graduate of Eastern Michigan University, with a degree in physical education.

She will be assisted in the aquatic program by Durrell Burton, a physical education major at the University of Michigan; Mary Ellen Senkowski, an associate professor of physical education at Cortland State College, N.Y.; and Craig Auten, who has worked in the Y pool throughout the past year.


