"HISPANIC," Kepack explained, is a legal term used by the federal government for the census. It covers persons of Spanish, South American, Mexican and Cuban ancestry. Terms like "Chicano" and "Latino" are going out of use.

The Michigan 1980 census showed 1 percent of the population as Hispanic, but Kopack thinks they were undercounted and closer to 2 percent.
