This kind of research is being done to learn more about what does provoke occasional attacks. If we learn what is normal, we can learn about what is causing the abnormal. Following a bear around the woods at close range may sound cray, but it has produced a tremendous amount of information regarding the behavior and requirements of wild animals.

Continued work on the Kirtland's warbler by dedicated people has probably kept this species from ex-tinction. Years of research on its northern Michigan breeding range have yielded enough information to allow man to maintain the popula-


