Students from Walled Lake and Walled Lake Western High School take a trip into the future to see what occupations await them in the workplace of tomorrow.

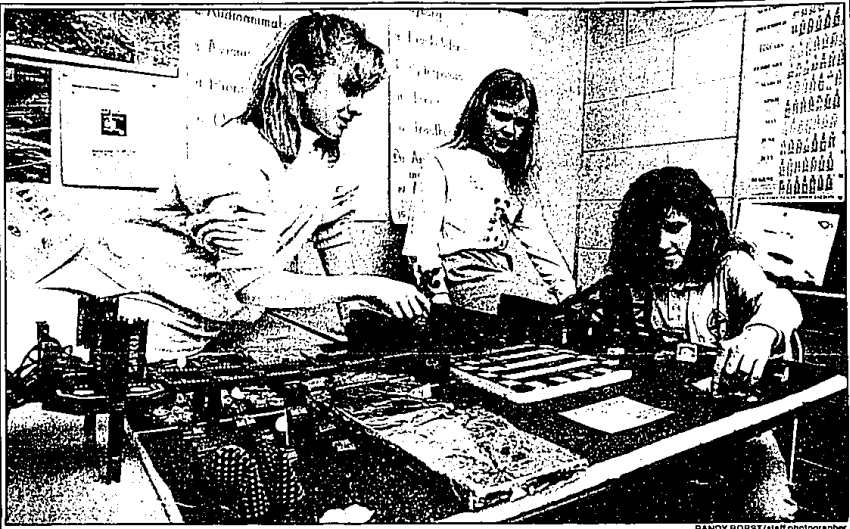
The students will visit "Michigan Works '89: A Journey Through the American JobWarp," on display April 5-6, in Oakland Hall of the Cobo Conference/Exhibition Center, Detroit.

During their visit, they will see how 30 different occupations have changed in as little as a decade, and how those jobs could change in the

future. They will have an opportunity to speak with workers and learn what new skills or advanced education is needed for the jobs of the future.

Actual work situations, including a functioning garage and a high-tech crime lab, will show visitors the technology used in each job.

# Students design, build future city

DELTA students from three Farmington schools completed their first "Future Home Show" after designing and building a model future city.

DELTA is an acronym for Differentiated, Enrichment, Leader-

ship, Talent and Ability. The department handles gifted education for the Farmington Public Schools.

Students involved in the program were from Beechview, Flanders, Wooddale and Eagle elementary schools. The project is a culmination

of an eight-week unit that covered topics related to architectural design, astrophysics and aeronautical sciences.

In addition to designing and building a model future city, students also developed the city's

transportation system, set laws, formed a government and medical systems, and developed recreation.

Parents were invited to two evenings, where students tried to sell real estate in these future cities.
