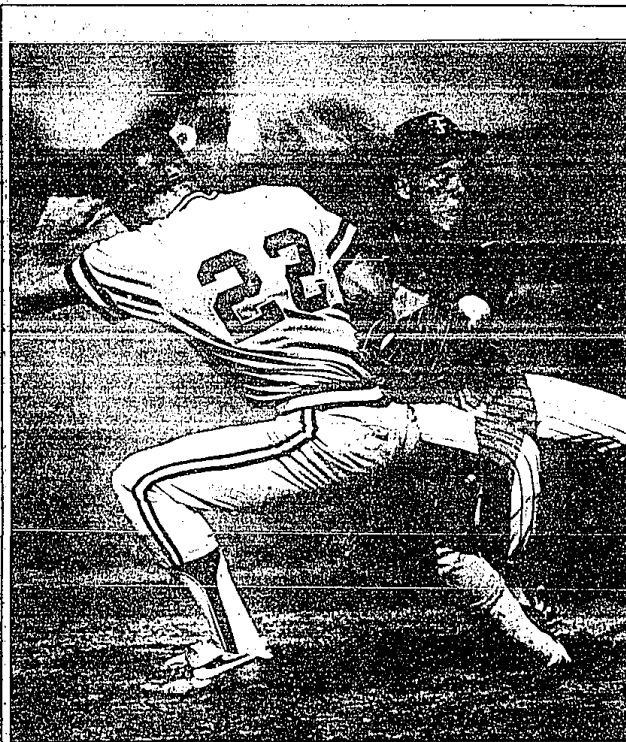

# Farmington coasts to win

Farmington fit the description of a league contender in girls track and field Thursday when the Falcons blatted Livonia Churchill 80-48.

The Chargers were runners-up to Plymouth Canton in the Western Lakes Activities Association last year and dropped to 1-3 in dual meets this year. It was the first dual for Farmington, which won the city championship April 13.

Jennifer Reed was instrumental in the lopsided victory, winning three events and helping the Falcons win the 400-meter relay. Reed jumped 15 feet 4 1/4 inches in the long jump, and she won two sprint races as well. She was timed at 12.7 in the 100 dash and 23.3 in the 200.

Farmington dominated the field events, with Kerri Owczarzak taking first place in the shot put (29-9) and the discus (99-11). Julie Lawton won the high jump at 5 feet. Jennifer Kiel also was a double winner, finishing at the top in the 1,600 and 3,200 runs. She had a 5:37.7 time in the mile and was clocked at 12:49.7 for the longer distance.



In other individual events, Shell Gaul won the 100 hurdles in 16.9, and Amy Trunk captured the 400 dash in 1:06.5.

Reed, Gaul, Carrie Malar and Angie Forge completed the 400 relay in 5:15, and Malar, Nicole Tocco, Trunk and Forge had a 1:51.8 time in the 800 relay.

Churchill won the 1,600 relay (4:25.2) and the 3,200 relay (10:56).

**FARMINGTON DIDN'T** fare as well in the boys competition, losing 82-55 to the Chargers, 2-2.

The Falcons had success in the open running events, but lost Churchill got the better of them in the field events, hurdles and relays.

Farmington's Lamont Hardge won the 100 and 200 dashes in 11.3 and 23.4, and the Falcons won all but the open 400. Gene Tokraks topped the

field with an 800 time of 2:08.9. Brad Moore captured the 1,600 run in 4:51.0 and Ben Goba went 10:21.2 in the 3,200 run.

The only other victories for Farmington came in the shot put, in which Jason Gutting recorded a 48-foot 1 1/4-inch throw, and the 3,200 relay in which the Falcons had an 8:44.2 time.

Churchill's Jason Belaire won the high jump (6-0) and both hurdles races. He was timed at 15.0 in the high hurdles and 41.2 in the lows.

Trent Naumcheff captured the long jump (18-5 1/4) and was on two winning relay teams. In addition, Brian Kert won the pole vault (10-8). Jeff Bristow the discus (135-2) and Jeff Zawislak the 400 run (1:01.6).

In the relays, Naumcheff, Mike Spaccarotella, Jim Shryock and Chris Muzzo won the 400 (46.8), Naumcheff, Shryock, Belaire and Muzzo the 800 (1:35.8) and Zawislak, Jeff Grossman, Mark Pierce and Muzzo the 1,600 (3:41.9).

# Mercy back on track; Falcons top Spartans

Farmington Hills Mercy got back on the winning track in a big way Friday, sweeping a double-header from host Harper Woods Bishop Gallagher, 6-3 and 7-1.

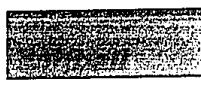
The Marlinas, 5-4 overall and 4-4 in the Catholic League, lost a double-header Tuesday to Livonia Ladywood.

Rockafellow helped her cause, going 3-for-4 with three RBIs.

Kelli Miller, Niki Italia and Carrie Palmisano had two hits each for Stevenson, with Miller driving in two runs.

**FRANKLIN 19, HARRISON 0:** The only thing Farmington Hills Harrison had going for it Friday was the home-field advantage. Livonia Franklin trounced the Hawks in a game called after five innings because of the mercy rule.

The Farmington Public Schools will receive sealed Proposals from qualified bidders for the New Elementary School Project - Phase I consisting of Bid Divisions 101: Earthwork to Tough Grade 10%; Site Utilities: 105; Temporary Fencing.
