## Volunteers needed for MDA camps

A Muscular Dystrophy Association-sponsored camp is a place where youngsters with muscular dystrophy and related neuromuscular diseases can experience pleasures that an active life has to offer and learn skills that they can enjoy year-round.

MDA supports a nationwide network of free summer camps offering a range of activities specially designed for children who have limited mobility or who use wheelchairs. These activities include fishing, swimming, horseback riding, arts and crafts, talent shows and cookouts.

Each day is filled with things to do and many new and exciting adventures that speed the hours away.

Camp programs, although structured, are conducted in a relaxed atmosphere that gives campers an unmatched opportunity to develop new friendships, share interests and build self-confidence.

At MDA camp, volunteer attendants are assigned to work with campers on a one-to-one basis. These volunteers, usually high school or college students, are with their campers around the clock to provide care, close attention and supervision that children with muscle disease need.

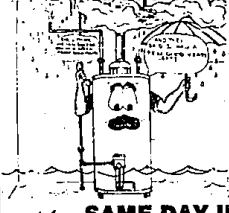
Attendants even "bunk down" near their campers, many of whom require assistance during the night. For an attendant, MDA camp means lots of physical exertion — pushing a

wheelchair, lifting a child or providing other assistance he or she may need. Prescribed medical treatment and therapy are administered at MDA camps by physicians, nurses and therapists, who contribute their services.

If you are 16 or older, you may apply to serve as an MDA camp volunteer by calling 313-8338. The camp sessions are being held June 25

to July 2 and July 9-15 in the Port Huron area. Male volunteers are needed.

MDA camps in your area and across the country are made possible by the generosity of a concerned American public through contributions to the Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon and other fund-raising projects year-round that benefit MDA.

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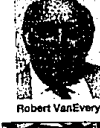
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
