

Cable production means more than taping

That's a wrap! When the production is done. Log the tape, put away the equipment and take down the set. Good night to everyone. Whoa, wait a minute.

There is one very important person who is a must to see. . . she has the magic wand to the scheduling of Channel 12 . . . introduce yourself to Mary Conway, program director for Channel 12. Mary prepares the schedule two weeks in advance for the respective newspaper schedule deadline. Therefore, remember to share with her your upcoming shows even if they aren't finished. Mary suggests that you remember several things:

- finish your show
- log and label your tape
- secure editing time.
- Talk to Mary Conway about cable-casting times, which would be best for your show.

From community access television policies to the structure we reference: Access presentations will be tentatively scheduled for cablecast after production has been completed, considering the audience addressed. At such time, they should specify which access channel they would prefer. Cablecast times and days will be scheduled by the programming coordinator with consideration of the producer's request. Remember Friday is open for your convenience requests.
