HARBOR SPRINGS, MICH.— The state's amateur actors let their hair down last weekend (Sept. 27-29) as they motored their way through the 18th fall convention of the Community Theatre Association of Michigan (CTAM). More than 280 members of Michigan's community theater associations participated in the conference. Delegates from the Livonia-Redford Theatre Guild; the Wayne Civic Players and the Plymouth Theatre Guild were all present. The Farmington Players are members of the CTAM, but did not send delegates.

OFFICIALLY the topic of the convention was play promotion and publicity. Unofficially, however, the three days concentrated on the swapping among the various groups.

Labor Exhibit

The Detroit Public Library and Wayne State University are sponsoring an exhibit entitled "150 Years of Organized Labor in Detroit" in the Adam Strohm Hall of the Detroit Main Library. Open during regular library hours, the exhibit will continue through Saturday, Oct. 19.

The exhibit consists of photos, early handbills, books and other items illustrative of the rise of Detroit's labor movement. Sixteen panels portray the life of the labor movement in Detroit from the Mechanics Society of 1818 to the giant trade unions of today. Themes covered include Early Labor Days, the Unionization of the Auto Industry, The Mechanics Society, Child Labor, The Woman Worker, The Teamsters, and the IWW in Detroit.
