Computers help city up productivity

Four new personal computers and hook-up to a county-based tax receivable system should improve the way that Farmington handies its business, city officials said this

week.


The technological changes come on the heels of ongoing building renovations to the city hall designed to make offices more efficient and ac-

cesible to the pounc.

The \$11,500 worth of PCs and related equipment will be used in the city clerks and city manager's offices for a variety of things, including minutes, record maintenance, budging, purchasing and project management. The computers will be linked within individual departments to facilitie better efficiency.

The tax receivables system will allow the city to interface with the Oakland County land and tax billing system, giving city treasurer Patsy Cantrell and her staff to have a daily

Cantrell and her staff to have a daily handle on tax payments and regular, computerized delinquency reports. It will cost the city \$2,400 per year. "It's been needed for quite some time." said city manager Robert Deadman. "There are others using it now, and they are very satisfied with it."
