## Condo site plan OK'd

The site plan has been approved for "Greenpointe at Copper Creek" in Farmington Hills, a \$20-million square development of the Greenpointe condominium development at 11 Mile and Halsted in West Bloomfield.

Construction will begin in July at the new site on the south side of 13 Mile, between Halsted and Hagerly, said developer Bernard Gillebrun, president of Crosswinds Communities.

"Greenpointe sold out in record time; less than a dozen of the origi-

nal 438 condominium homes are left after only a little over two years," said Gillebrun. "We expect the same results with Greenpointe at Copper Creek, because we are going with the most popular designs from the original Greenpointe."

The designs are ranch and townhouse models with two bedrooms, two-car attached garages and basements.

Greenpointe at Copper Creek will have 136 condominium homes.
