Nearly done

Work on the second phase of downtown Farmington streetscape improvements is slated to be completed by June 30, so it won't conflict with Founder's Festival activities in July. New sidewalks, curbing, pedestrian lighting and greenery are being installed along Farmington Road as part of the year project, which is expected to cost \$1.4 million. The project is funded by a 2-mill taxation to property owners in the Downtown Development Authority district, and through tax increment financing methods. 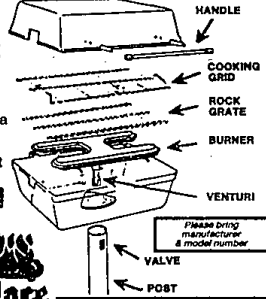
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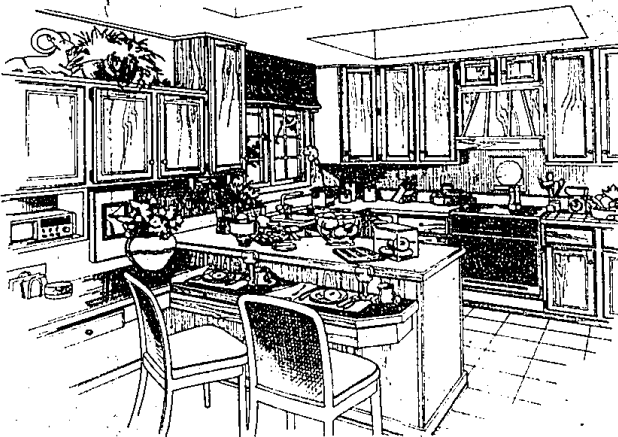
