MOT has an option to buy the Grand Circus Theater until July. In the last few months, the company has ordered structural and engineering studies to determine the actual extent of needed removation. Elated MOT officials say those studies indicate the building is in far better condition than expected. The water in the basement is from the leaking roof and asbeston wasn't used in the plaster.

Better it is a poperance, this building is a long way from falling down, and Shephardson. "Can you believe it was last used in 1983?"

Detroit has the largest collection of Crane theaters in the country—the Fox Theatre (1928) is the largest and most ornate and Orchestra Hall (1919) is an early example of his more intimate style and skill for achieving perfect acoustics.



"The roof is covered with wood to house the restaurant that was originally planned," he said.

If MOT exercises its option to buy this theater, it will be one of the few opera companies to own its own building, Company treasure Cameron B. Duncan estimates the entire project will cost the company \$15-30 mm. "What I want to do is to take a year to make the plans for the building and then spend the next two years rebuilding and renovating," said Shepardson.

IT IS DANGEHOUS to walk out into the theater proper to view the stage because of the weakened floors. MOT's General Director David DiChalers and he needs at least 75 feet back stage to mount sets for the operas, to avoid what lappened (Masonie Temple has about 56 feet.)
