Senior staff moving to Mercy

Farmington Hills senior adult division staff will work from the senior adult activity center at Mercy Center, instead of continuing to commute from the city hall, beginning July 1.
The city will lease seven court-yard suites, totaling 1,110 square feet, for one year for \$11,110.
"This will provide for more efficient operations, eliminating travel time for the senior adult administrative staff," said Loretta Conway, senior adult supervisor.
"It will put staff in direct contact with senior adult participants on a daily basis."
The senior adult division provides transportation, volunteer, outreach, nutrition, home chore and exercise services.
