My kitchen chairs are ladder-k and have rush seats. We'yo had chairs for many years, and the th on the seats has worn. Should I for a place to redo the rush, and re would I find such a place?

Agree would I find such a place?

A. Forget replacing the rish acats, it would be very cortly. Buying new chairs would make more sense. I suggest you add seat cushions over the rush. The backs to hold the cushion in place can be made to have large saucy bows with streamers 14 inches long.

Another way would be a seat cushion with "ballerina" ites. Wrap the ties around the back chair leg the way you would a ballet slipper. In

this case your ties would be very marrow and the bottom bow short. If you are rectoing your kitches will be not be not an additionable of the same fabric. Repeating the fabric on the windows in that case would be attractive.


