## Center marks 20th year

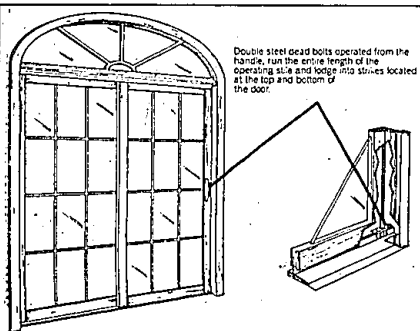
