erale sales experience in the past," says Teeple. "In charge of zoning violations, Taylor has been mentioned in the past as a partner of a business with people in Farmington Township."

TEEPLES SAYS replacements will be hired for Snover and Taylor, but the vacancy left by Lush's departure will not be filled. Lush was being paid \$10,900 a year.

In explaining the dismissals, Teeple said Taylor, Lush and Snover reportedly did not keep adequate files

and did not follow up efficiently on violations.

"As a result, some time ago, a newspaper expose resulted in revealing numbers of building violations. These have not been cleared yet."

"Literally hundreds of buildings have not received final inspections including the Township Hall and other large buildings. There is a backlog of cases, none of which has been worked on for some time."

THE SUPERVISOR said replacements will be made by hiring township residents where possible. "Living and working in the same area allows an inspector to do a better job. He sees more."
