

Ribcrackers return for model airshow

Quarter scale military aircraft, simulated air combat, and specialty model aircraft will be featured at a model airshow, Saturday and Sunday at North Farmington High School. The show is staged in conjunction with Farmington Founders Days activities and is sponsored by Farmington Jaycees and Ribcrackers Radio Control Club. Show hours will be Saturday 10 to 5 and Sunday noon to 5.

Members of a dozen area Radio Control clubs will compete for audience awarded prizes voted for the most impressive or spectacular demonstration. Two hundred aircraft are expected to participate during the two day show.

The 1989 show will feature the Academy of Model Aeronautics Showteam. Members of the showteam from a three state area will provide a variety of audience oriented aircraft entertainment during a two hour segment of the show, beginning Sunday at noon.

Impressive 1/4 scale models with wingspans of 3 feet or more duplicate the appearance and flight of current full scale craft of WW II aircraft such as the well known P-51 Mustang. These sophisticated models are a crowd favorite and provide scale like performance utilizing gasoline chain saw engine power.

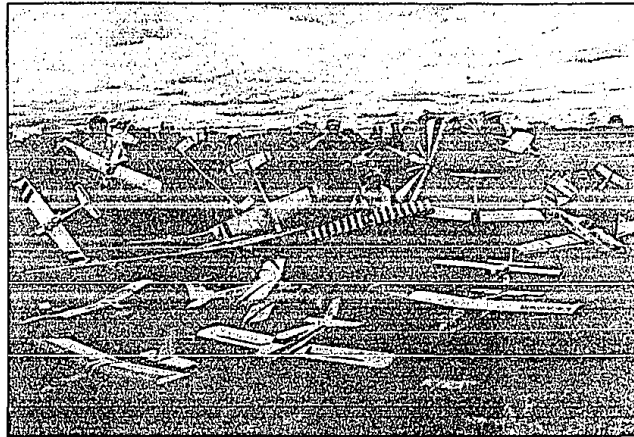
THE SHOW will include helicopters, aerobatics, contests, bomb drops, electric gliders, and a model Swap Shop. Members of the Ribcracker club will be available to answer questions about the construction and control of the models.

Admission is \$2 with children under 14 free. Advanced tickets are available for \$1 and automatically qualify purchasers for the airshow raffle. The raffle prize, a completed and ready to fly Eagle II model aircraft, will be built by a Ribcracker team during the show. The building project is designed to familiarize the public with the model building process and has succeeded in drawing a crowd of curious aircraft enthusiasts.

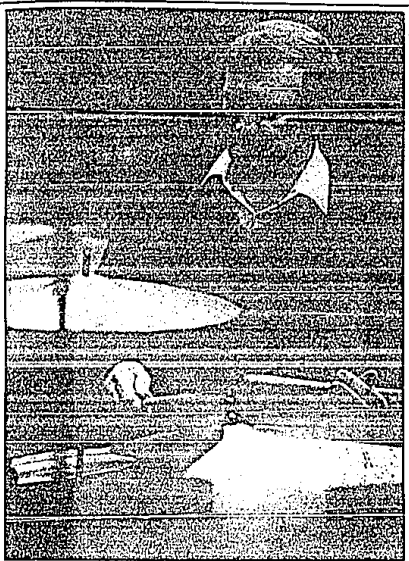
Refreshments will be available as well as free parking. Advanced tickets can be purchased from the Farmington Chamber of Commerce,
