As of Tuesday, DRC Public Rela-tions Director Bob Raymond could confirm only "four definites," with the prohibitive favorite being Proper Reality, a 4-year-old brown colt boasting nine wins in 15 starts with more than \$1.4 million in career earnings.

The other three "definitios" in-clude: Mi Selecto, a grass specialist and recent winner of the \$150,000 Dominion Day Handleap in Toronto (July 1); Present Value, a two-time winner in \$9 being shipped in trom Kentucky, and Air Worthy, owned by Farmington Hills center contractor John Cartesium. Proper Reality, bred in Florida and owned by 61-year-old Mrs. James Winn of 16th Springs, Ark, may follow in the flostleps of previous Mile winners Waquot (1987) and Lost Code (1988), each of whom wen in romps.


