

# Mantle club blisters foes

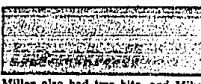
South Farmington may have stumbled when it traveled to Wisconsin for a national tournament recently, but the little Caesars Mickey Mantle League.

Coach Lou Pirronello's ballclub chalked up four more victories after returning from its out-of-state trip to run its league record to 14-0. South, 18-3 overall, is one of two undefeated teams, Taylor being the other.

Farmington knocked off Westland II 10-3 Tuesday, ripped Livonia Stevenson 11-5 in a makeup game Monday, swept a double-header from Lincoln Park Travel 10-1 and 9-1 on Saturday and trashed Livonia Franklin 13-5 last Thursday.

In Tuesday's win over Westland II, Eric Miller kept his earned run average perfect by tossing a two-hitter. Miller, 4-0, walked six and struck out six, but did not give up an earned run. He has yet to do so this season.

Jay Burley got three of South's eight hits, scored three runs and drove in one, and stole three bases including home plate with two out in the fourth, tying the game at 4-4.



Miller also had two hits, and Mike Campbell and Scott Lakatos each had two-run singles. South scored five runs in the final two innings to pull away.

IN THE STEVENSON game, winning pitcher Lakatos issued 11 walks, but his teammates supported him with 13 hits while he limited the Spartans to five. Lakatos went the distance, striking out five.

Miller led the offense, going 2-for-2, which included a three-run triple, and collecting four RBI.

Reggie McKinney, Shondell Currie and Lakatos also had two hits apiece. McKinney and Currie contributed three RBI and, in the first inning, two-run singles.

In the Saturday doubleheader, Brian Currie and Mike Jozwiak turned in masterful, complete-game pitching performances. Viechlo pitched a two-hitter and struck out 15 opposing batters in the first game, and

Jozwiak fanned 12 and scattered four hits in the nightcap.

South's 16-hit attack in the opener included a two-run homer by Miller and a 3-for-4 showing by Matt Finley, who had a pair of doubles. Burley drove in four runs with two hits, including two RBI with a triple. Currie was 3-for-6, had two RBI and stole four bases, and Viechlo helped his cause by going 3-for-4 and getting one RBI.

Jozwiak did likewise in the second game, registering a 3-for-3 game. He had two RBI, one coming on a solo homer. Les Luark had two hits, including a two-run triple, and both of McKinney's two hits went for extra bases.

In the Franklin game, Tyrone O'Neill pitched the last 4½ innings to get the victory in relief of Luark, the starter who surrendered three hits and three runs in 2½ innings. O'Neill allowed three hits and six walks, and also struck out six.

Currie and Miller had three hits apiece in that game, Dennis Pirronello was 2-for-2 and Finnelly, John Benninger and McKinney added two-run singles.
