many hours of work beginning in January. The seeds are sown in trays and then transferred to six-inch pots. The number of plants involved, bogies the mind.

"This gentleman grows all the plants from seeds, uses them all in his garden or gives them away — 7,000 of them. He contemplates what he wants to do with the gardens while traveling to and from work. He puts nothing to paper. When the plants are grown up and are almost in flower — when he is ready to set them out, that's when he designs the garden.

"The tallest flowers are planted in the back and then others follow according to height. Bamboo is used for staking tall flowers, which is unobtrusive.

PADDON SAYS that the hardest time is the spring when he is preparing the soil (usually about the second week in April) either retilling the annual beds or hand-forking, called tilling. The fork is put down into

the soil about four inches and twisted to loosen it around the plant without disturbing the roots. The perennial beds, and then the actual planting, begins around the second week in May. He begins on the beds close to the house where they are least likely to be damaged by frost.

In the fall he sheds leaves and mounds them on the beds to be mixed into the soil in the spring, thus eliminating the need for a lot of fertilizer.

He is very careful about using pesticides as he enjoys the birds (which he feeds), bees and butterflies. Paddon says working in his gardens is his anti-stress therapy. He used to grow the flowers for himself. Now he grows them for everybody.

"There are so many ugly things in the world today if you can put a little beauty back in, you've got it made, that's what I've tried to do," he said.

This is from a man who, at the age of eight had his own little spot of ground and had success with a package of radish seeds. He's a perennial winner.
