## gardener's book nook **Marty Figley**

I have just finished reading a relisue of a delightful book, "An Island
Gardon," by Colla Thanter Houghton
Mifflin, 319.95, hardcover. First published in 1884, illustrated by Childe
Hassam, an important American Inpressionist, this. edition again includes the fillustrations.
Thanter, a popular poet, was encouraged to write a book about her
garden, which is off the coast of New
Hampshire on Appledore Island,
where her parents built a resort ho-

tel during the 18th century.

She writes with complete honesty, of her successes and failures, with opport's descriptive phrasing. Her account of introducing loads in the garden, and the way she deals with weeds and pests, makes pleasant reading, but her knowledge of plant life and the wonder of it is awe inspiring.

Gardening tips, such as planting sreds in an egaphell and the information about the many plants grown (mostly from seeds) are entertaining as well as informative. I was templed to list the plants and make a record of their needs as I read the book.

"Gertrude Jekyll, A Vision of Gr. den and Wood," J.B. Tankard, Michael R. Van Valkenburgh, Harry N. Abrams, Inc., 435 hardcover, is a lesson in landscaping and design. Time is needed to study the script ia swell as the photographs to fully appreciate Jekyll's genius. She took the photographs at Munstead Wood, her

home in Surry, England, where she tried new ideas and developed her unique style.

The book gives insight into why and bow the gardens were designed. A landscape drawing of the crate includes numbers which correspond to the pholographs, so the reader can more fully envision the setting. Although generally our gardens aren't as extensive as many in England, one can still use the concepts of this fascinating and forward thinking woman.

"Garden Style," Penelope Hobouse, Little, Brown, \$40 hardcover, gives ideas for any style of garden. The author explains how to relate the garden to the whole landscape, large or small. Every detail of planting a garden, formal or otherwise, even a single planting, is explained in an easy-to-read and understand style. Hobbouse has designed many gardens and is also a lecturer and writer.

The photographs clearly show the

various gardens and the plants, with accompanying descriptions, including mazes. By the end of the 17th century, mazes of stone, rock or turf were replaced by plants grown above head height to deliberately confuse as well as amuse.

I especially like the section which catures inner gardens, garden rooms, and informal garden areas. This book would make a lovely gift for a gardener who likes the chilenge of designing.

"Trees for Small Gardens," Brispart of a new series of libustrated guides to ald in choosing specific plants for special areas. A list of \$90 varieties of trees, alphabetically by Latin and common names, illustrated in color, will make tree shopping easier. Types of soil, amount of sun, landing, pruning and general hardiness requirements are included. The second book in this series is. "Flowering Trees and Shrubs."
