## Area graduates get FEA scholarships

The Farmington Education Association has awarded \$3,000 in scholarships to graduating seniors from the three Farmington-area public high schools.

These students were selected on the basis of their fine academic records and personal involvement in school and community activities. Funds for the scholarships were donated by Farmington teachers.

PINZL HAS plans to attend the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor. She is a member of the Harrison National Honor Society and was the captain of three varsity teams including volleyball, basketball and softball. She earned a 4.0

grade point average during her high school career.

Niskar also plans to attend U-M to obtain a nursing degree. She earned an academic letter from North Farmington High and participated in the U-M scholar's celebration. A Senior Board representative and member of the French Club, Niskar spent much of her time volunteering with such agencies as Sinai Hospital of Detroit and the Jewish Association for Retarded Citizens.

Zhytowksi has plans to attend Michigan State University, studying pre-law and communications. She has been active on her school newspaper and was an officer in the National Honor Society. As a member of the forensic team, she was a state finalist on three separate occasions. Jennifer also volunteers her time in the Youth Service Group, which performs community service projects.
