Hills seeks grants to develop parks

Farmington Hills will apply for state grants to develop a south-end park and to build a day camp facility at Heritage Park.

The city will apply through the Michigan Department of Natural Resources for a 75-25 matching grant under the Quality of Life Bond Program (Proposal D).

With a grant, the city's share of developing a south-end park would be \$150,000, city manager William Costick said.

The \$450,000 park would feature athletic fields, picnic facilities and a parking area.

Last year, Farmington Hills received approval for a \$300,000 50-50 matching grant from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund to buy 15 acres for a south-end park. The purchase should be completed by late fall, Costick said.

A grant would make the city's

share of a Heritage Park day camp building \$82,500. The \$250,000 building would include restrooms and be accessible to handicapped people.

The day camp program is now based in an old sheep barn.

The program has grown from one seven-week summer season to five summer camps running for eight weeks and several winter and spring camps during holiday and school breaks.

Scout troops could use the building for camp outings. The building also could be used for other programs such as cross country skiing programs, nature programs, nature photography classes, a Halloween walk, and fishing and hunting classes, Costick said.

The Farmington Hills Parks and Recreation Commission has recommended both projects for grant application.

Heard, a Western Illinois University graduate, has received a Student Life Scholarship of \$1,000 a year, renewable for four years, based on academic achievement and contributions to campus and community life.




