"I was warming up, and I thought 'Wow, this is my last event in high school, and it kinda brought tears to my eyes.

"After that, every time I went to a meet it made me feel like running. The doctor said it wouldn't do

any more damage and it would wear off, so I was glad to run again and help my teammates."

Following an absence of several weeks, Burgess returned to finish fourth in the 800-meter run at the Class B meet and thereby carn all-state honors in a third sport. In June, Burgess competed in the Tri-State Meet of Champions in Indian-polis and, ranked 17th in the 800 at the start, finished seventh.

Burgess demonstrated further versatility this summer when he performed, with impressive results, for the South Farmington Connie Mack baseball team. He was 4-0 as a pitcher and 4-for-6 as a batter.

"The last time I played baseball was two years ago, and I thought it would be fun to get back with the guys one more time," he said. "I did it just to have fun and didn't expect to do as well as I did."

Burgess, being true to his unas-suming naturé, may understate the degree of his accomplishments, but the results speak for themselves.


