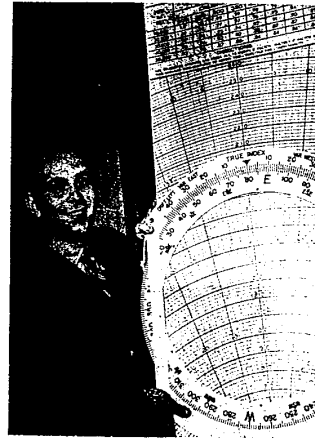

Ground School First In Area

A complete aircraft ground school--designed to meet specifications of the Federal Aeronautics Administration--will begin Monday, Jan. 18, under auspices of the Northwest YWCA, 25940 Grand River, Redford Township.

Jay Zrimec of Farmington, coordinator of the course that is the first of its kind in this area, said the study would be divided into four sections, and those interested could take all or any part.

"The full course will cover all the training that is needed to go with actual flight instruction in order to get a

pilot license," Zrimec said. "But there may be many who need only a part of the instruction, and that is the reason for dividing the study."

THE CHARGE will be \$27.50 for each of the four sections.

The course is likely to interest many persons who do not intend to get a pilot's license, Zrimec said. These include science teachers, pilots' wives, persons in flight-related industries and former pilots who want to brush up.

Bill Mauldin, whose cartoons span the years from World War II to Vietnam, comes to the Livonia Town Hall with a lecture at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday, Jan. 20, in the Terrace Theater, 3040 Plymouth, Livonia.

The famed creator of G.I. Willie and Joe, also a Pulitzer Prize winner, will appear later at a celebrity luncheon in the Mayflower Meeting House, Plymouth.

Information on luncheon reservations can be found on the last page of this year's Town Hall brochures.

MAULDIN will answer questions following his talk in the theater.

Also on the theater program will be the introduction of three American Field

Service exchange students studying in Livonia this year.

They are Isabel de Carpio Borda of Bolivia, Ake Flin-tull of Sweden and Lizette Contreras of Honduras. Town Hall proceeds help support their visits to this country.

BILL MAULDIN won fame and his first Pulitzer with cartoons that showed World War II as the foot soldier saw it. His best known book, "Up Front," is a collection of these cartoons.

His post-war activities included publication of four more books including "Bill Mauldin in Korea" and an unsuccessful try for a seat in Congress.
