A Farmington mother of four now is helping women who seek to find their true niche in life through the services of the Continuum Center at Oakland University.

Mrs. Sandra Landsman is the center's new counselor assigned to help participants

in the Investigation Into Identity program.

In this capacity, she will supervise education, vocational and personality tests that begin the program when it is offered Jan. 21 to Feb. 18 in the Northwest Unitarian-Universalist Church, 23925 Northwestern, Southfield.

The investigation program, funded by the Kellogg Foundation, is designed to help women find new life styles and give them more self knowledge and self-confidence.

road to fulfillment and career satisfaction is in counseling of adults.

She was one of the first Wayne State University students to specialize in working with adults in earning a masters degree in guidance and counseling.

She also holds a Specialty in Aging Certificate in Education from the Institute of Gerontology, co-sponsored by the University of Michigan and Wayne State University.

IN HER WORK with the Continuum Center, Mrs. Landsman helps participants decide whether they are interested in employment, education or volunteer service — or a combination of any of those.

"I am not there to give answers," she explains, "but to help participants ask their own answers. I cannot solve their problems, but help them clarify what problems they have and how to deal with them."

"I try to enable them to reach their full potential."

with a free orientation session from 12:30 to 3:30 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 21.

After the orientation, women may decide to complete the program.

Court Administrator To Address Plymouth BPW

Mrs. Margaret Clixby, Southfield attorney who won two top awards during the last year, will be speaker for the Plymouth Business and Professional Women's dinner meeting at 6:30 p.m. Monday, Jan. 18, in Hillside Inn.

Mrs. Clixby was winner of the 1970 Ruth Houston Whipple award, given by the Plymouth BPW at the organization's state convention in honor of Plymouth's only woman mayor, who was in office from 1936 to 1942.

The speaker also received the Liberty Bell award last year from the Oakland County Bar Association.

MRS. CLIXBY is administrator for the 46th District Court, which has jurisdiction over the cities of Southfield and Lathrup and the villages of Beverly Hills, Bingham Farms and Franklin.

In that capacity, she supervises a staff of 22 court officers, process servers, secretaries and deputy court clerks.

Formerly clerk for the 46th District Court after serving as Southfield's Municipal Court clerk, she was the only clerk in Michigan to swear in the two district judges in her area.

DURING HER TIME as administrator, the 46th District Court has initiated a complex transition to computerized court operations.

This move will supply the court with complete records of fines due or paid, trial dates and disposition of cases, as well as statistics to assist in refining court procedures.

Mrs. Clixby, a native Detroit, is married and the mother of four children, two married and two in college.

She and her husband, George, have for more than a decade been active in the Youth For Understanding program that cooperates with the U.S. State Department to bring foreign exchange students to this country and send American students to other lands.

DURING THAT TIME, the Clixby family has been host to three full-year and three summer exchange students. In addition, Mr. and Mrs. Clixby made two trips to Europe as YFU counselors and represented Southfield in presenting keys from the city to governing bodies in several foreign cities they visited.

Mrs. Clixby served as president of the Southfield BPW from 1962 to 1964 and also is active in Eastern Star, the Quota Club of Oakland County and Southfield United Presbyterian Church.
