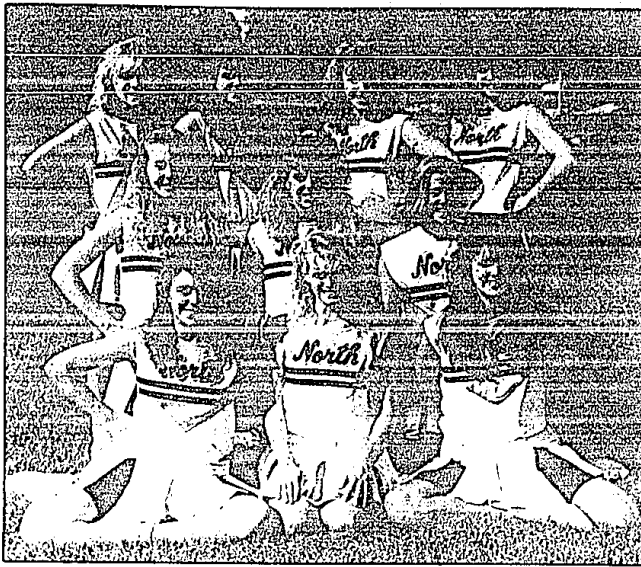

SOME TIPS for canning without
SUGAR

Substitute a light colored fruit juice, such as apple or white grape juice, instead of sugar syrup.

Pretreat light colored fruits such as peaches or pears with a commercial ascorbic acid mixture.

If you wish to use added artificial sweeteners, do so at serving time. They do not can well.


