

Grant allows 'World of Difference' to continue

The Anti-Defamation League's award-winning human relations training program for teachers — World of Difference — has been extended another year.

The program, which features a unique human relations study guide and training for teachers, reached over 3,000 teachers throughout the tri-county area, according to Linda Soberman, president of ADL's Michigan regional board. Numerous training sessions were conducted for local colleges of education, as well.

The one-year program — which actually lasted two years — was scheduled to end by June of 1989. It was originally funded through grants from the Skillman Foundation and the MichCon Foundation, with the assistance of Pepsi Cola Community Foundation of Southeast Michigan, National Bank of Detroit, First of America Bank, and DeRoy Testametary Foundation.

Partners in the original program were the Civil Rights Task Force of Metropolitan Detroit, The Detroit Free Press, and WDIV-Channel 4.

PRIMARY SOURCE of funds for extending the program comes from the Skillman Foundation, founded in December of 1960, by Rose P. Skillman, widow of Robert H. Skillman, Vice President of director of Minnesota Mining and Manufacturing Company.

The Foundation is a private, grant-making foundation with assets totaling \$275 million. It makes

Adult classes - high-touch, high-tech

From helping manufacturers stay competitive to the study of humankind, typically the range of programs offered this fall by Oakland University's Division of Continuing Education in Rochester.

In the area of high tech, the new certificate program, "Production and Manufacturing Management," beginning Sept. 18, will present the latest technologies in production and inventory control that are important for quality and profit.

A free information evening about the new program is scheduled from 6:30-7:30 p.m., Thursday, Sept. 7, on campus.

In the area of high touch, the study of great literature and great minds will be offered in two separate non-credit evening programs held in the library of Meadow Brook Hall on campus. "Classics of the Western Tradition" and "Enigma of Genius" The Classics program begins Sept. 12 with Shakespeare's "Hamlet," followed by great works by Homer, Plato and Hawthorne. OU faculty will in-

struct; however, there will be no papers or exams.

The second program at Meadow Brook Hall, "Enigma of Genius," presents prominent leaders in the arts and sciences speaking on genres in their particular area of accomplishment. Guest Herbig, Detroit Symphony Orchestra conductor; Samuel Sachs, Detroit Institute of Arts director; and Lew Ayers, actor and author, are among the speakers. Three seminars are scheduled for fall: Sept. 28, Oct. 19 and Nov. 18.

ALSO OFFERED this fall are career programs, beginning the week of Sept. 18, the legal assistant and paraprofessional account programs and the certificate program in personal financial planning. Career opportunities will be discussed in free career information evenings on campus for the paralegal, 7:30-8:30 p.m., Sept. 5; for the paraprofessional accountant, 6:30-7:30 p.m., Sept. 6; for the financial planner, 7:30 p.m., Sept. 7. Graduates and program directors will

present programs for prospective paralegals and paraprofessional accountants.

Speakers for prospective financial planners will be Daniel H. Boyce, a financial planner and Observer's Economic columnist, cited by Money Magazine as one of the top financial planners in the nation. Reservations for the career evenings can be made with the Continuing Education office, Call 370-3120.

Business-related courses include computer classes in WordPerfect, conducted on Wednesdays, Sept. 20-Oct. 11, and in the basics of operating an IBM PC, Saturdays, Sept. 23-Oct. 14. Lotus 1-2-3 will be instructed Saturdays, Oct. 21-Nov. 11. New business courses include one-day workshops: credit and collections, Oct. 17; and basic bookkeeping for owners, managers and general staff, Oct. 12.

Programs for professionals include an all-day Friday and Friday evening through Sunday program for CPA recalculation, Nov. 10-12.




