

2 classical pianists open Concert in the Hills series

"Concert In The Hills," sponsored by the Universalist Unitarian Church of Farmington, 25301 Haled Road, presents classical pianists Barbara Carbury and Barbara Robinson in recital at 3 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 17.

Carbury, a Mount Clemens resident, began her music studies at the

age of five, concentrating on piano at the age of 10. She received her bachelor's degree in music from Wayne State University, where she studied under the tutelage of Mischa Kottler. While at Wayne, she worked extensively as an accompanist, including two seasons with Sergio Pezzetti and the Bel Canto Ensemble

and a concert tour with the award-winning Chamber Singers under Dr. Harry M. Langford.

Upon graduation, Carbury developed a piano program for the Warren Consolidated Schools involving students of all ages in private and group classes. She has continued playing professionally throughout the metropolitan Detroit area as a soloist and accompanist. In addition to her teaching and administrative work with the Warren schools, she is an accompanist and children's choir director at St. Michael's Catholic Church in Sterling Heights.

Her recent projects include work with Phil Marcus Esser in "Sing Spring" and with Mr. Esser and Company in "Somerset Strut I & II," and the upcoming "Somerset Strut III."

ROBINSON received her bachelor degree in music theory and composition from Michigan State University and her master of arts degree from

Stephen F. Austin State University, Nacogdoches, Texas. Currently she is the director of music at St. Michael's Catholic Church in Sterling Heights where she is organist and director of four choirs.

Robinson free-lances for Detroit area productions; most recently Macomb Community College's "My Fair Lady."

Last year she was a recipient of a grant from the Michigan Council for the Arts and is now composing and arranging music for a liturgical dance project.

Upcoming recitals in the "Concert In The Hills" series include the Cassini Ensemble, the Langford Singers, and folk and blue grass artist Neil Woodward.
