


Pvt. Colleen Wortman of Farmington Hills completed an Army food service specialist course at Fort Jackson, S.C.


The course trained personnel to prepare and serve food in large and small quantities. Students received training in baking, field kitchen op-erations and the operation of an Army dining facility.


