

# CG runner makes comeback

That Dave Galvin finished as the No. 5 runner for Redford Catholic Central's cross country team Monday was not that noteworthy.

That Galvin ran at all certainly was.

The Farmington Hills senior, who was assaulted in a near-fatal attack last summer, recovered from his injuries and was well enough to run his first race Saturday at the Hazellet Invitational.

On Monday, he finished sixth overall with a 17:44 time as the No. 4-rated Shamrocks beat Harper Woods Notre Dame 17-46 at Metropolitan Beach in Harrison Township.

"We knew it would be not-that-difficult a race, but a real pleasant surprise was having Dave Galvin back," CO coach Tony Magni said. "We hoped he'd be back at the end of the season, but he came back earlier."

GALVIN, a member of the all-Observer team a year ago, was robbed and stabbed in the neck while returning home from work on a Sunday night last summer, according to Magni.

The prep star was stopped at a stoplight in Farmington Hills when two young males, one of his car and attacked him, Magni said. The suspects were never apprehended, the coach added.

In the 19-team Hazellet Invitational, CG recorded 62 team points, Stockbridge 27 and Okemos 109.

Sheridan was the top runner in that meet, too, finishing second in 15:50. Antezak and Schemanske also ran excellent races, taking sixth and seventh places, respectively in 16:57 and 16:58.

In addition, Wiktor was 22nd (17:22), Dimmer 40th (17:55) and Pat Koelzer 72nd (18:30).

# Warriors capture 5th county crown

If Monday's annual Oakland County Golf Tournament is any indication, Birmingham Brother Rice's slump may be over.

The Warriors won the 43-team tournament with an outstanding score of 305 — 10 strokes better than runner-up Birmingham Seaborn, which carded a 315. Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook was third at 316, followed by Rochester Adams at 327. Lake Orion and Walled Lake Western — which tied for fifth at 328 — were the only other schools to break the 330 barrier.

It was just the sixth time in the tournament's 29-year history a winning team has posted a score of less than 310. The victory was Rice's fifth overall — the best of any county team.

Rice's triumph Monday came on the heels of another sterling performance over the weekend where coach Jim Rademacher's crew placed second in the East Lansing Invitational despite a brilliant score of 303. Earlier in the season, the Warriors won the Grand Blanc Brighton and West Bloomfield Invitational.

LATELY, HOWEVER, they've been playing with rusty irons and plastic putters, including a pair of dual-match losses to arch rival Redford Catholic Central.

"We've played five tournaments where we've shot 308 or better. That's the upside," said Rademacher, whose team is 6-2 in dual-match competition. "The downside is we've also shot 337 and 342. We've done better on shorter courses which are more wide open."

"We've had some outstanding scores the last couple days. Some of these scores are the lowest I've ever had. But they're also some of the highest. We were really disappointed with the Eccentric tournament (Rice was fourth at 337)."

"I was wondering what was going on. It felt like we were starting to disintegrate a little the last couple weeks with a few bad outings. I was starting to get concerned," he said. "Hopefully we're starting to get back on track."

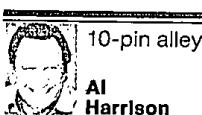
