1-696 will be eight lancs, four in
each direction, from I-275 to I-75,
except for three miles from Tele
graph Road to Southfield Road in

Six lanes, three in each direction.
When fully opened at a cost of 857 million in federal and state money, 1-698 will span 27 million, 1-75 in Farmington Hills-Novi to 1-94 in St. Clair Shores.
