Meadow Brook blunts quick witted Scoundrel

Dakland University's Meadow Brook Theatre opens its 1989-90 sea-son with a light, funny and rather tame production of Alexander Os-trovsky's "The Diary of a Seoun-rett," Ostrovsky (considered the fa-ther, of Russian theater) wrote this saylagely sattle councy in 1888, but the, characters he lampoons are timeless.

In fact, the script is extremely well suited to today's audiences due to a modern adaptation by playwright Erik Brogger. No danger here of being builded to stepe by turgid Russian dialogue. Paul DeBoy plays Glumov with
enflutusams and great skill. Because

DeBoy moves smoothly
from one character to the next, always managing to retain a certain
reptillan charm which endears him
to the audience in a perverted sort of
way.

Laughs abound as Glumov manipulaties each of his foolish, egotistics marks. The loveable bufloons of the supporting cast add a richness to the humor of the production.

Joseph Reed, as the pompous and guilblie Uncle Manuaey, is jolly and endearing. His sexually frustrated wife, Kleopatra, is played with bawdy lust by Pattl Perkins. Especially noteworthy for his comedic contributions is Phil Locker, whose rich baritone voice and keen sense of

the absurd make him a hillarious treat as the doddering old fool, General Kruitsky, Anita Barone, one of the Hillberry's brightest stars for the past three years, also does a fine job in her Meadow Brook debut as Mashenka, the object of Glumov's desires.

Terence Kilburn's direction is simed directly at the funny bone, and unfortunately seems calculated not to offend. While the play is lots of fun, it lacks the bite of vicious satieve which I think was originally intended. Like a good production of Moliere's "Tartuffe," "Scoundrel" should leave the audience laughing, the tabo a little unconfortable about their own pretensions and vanities.

THE MEADOW BROOK produc-tion, which features caricatures

rather than characters, relieves the audience of any guilt and leaves an amusing but unmemorable piece of

work.
As usual, Meadow Brook has done
