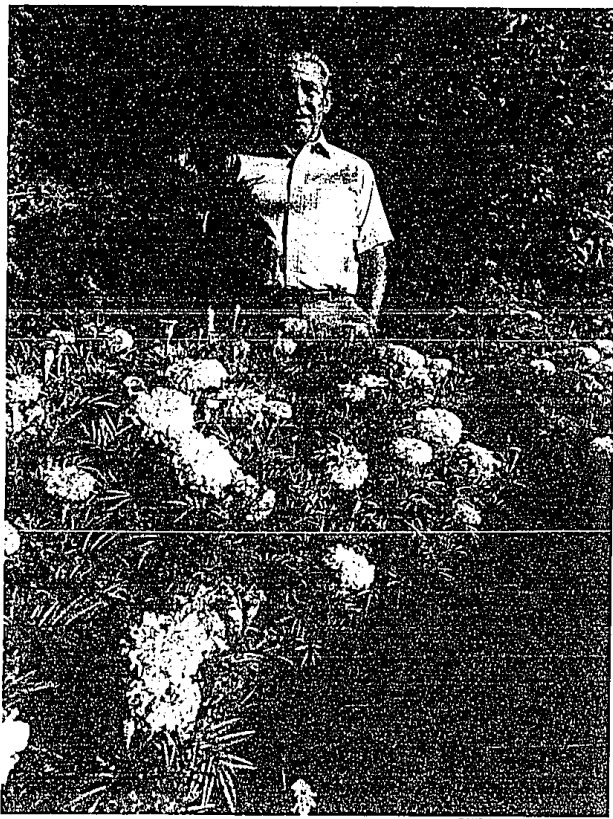


Spectacular

Hadassah annual telethon under way

The Greater Detroit Chapter of Hadassah is in the midst of its 1989-90 fund-raising drive.

Under the leadership of Francine Hack, the Gold and Silver Circle Dinners have raised \$254,000. The Hadassah Annual Telethon continues through November under the direction of Hilary Isakow and Mary Jo Wolfe.

This is the 20th year that Hadassah volunteers call each member for their support of Hadassah projects, which include Hadassah Medical Organization and Youth Aliyah.

The Hadassah Medical Organization, one of the largest and most up-to-date medical facilities in the Middle East, continues to be the leader in research and patient care.

Youth Aliyah, the world-wide child rescue and rehabilitation effort, was begun in 1934 by Recha Freier and Henrietta Szold, the founder of Hadassah.

Hadassah is one of the largest organizational contributors to Youth Aliyah. In the past few years the numbers of children in the program have been cut because of budget pressures. Today, with increased immigration, and more teen-age school dropouts, there is even greater pressure to increase the programs, and more money is needed.

For fitness, there are many directed gym and pool exercise sessions offered for adults.

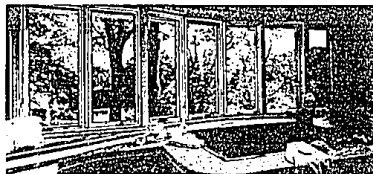
The pool, as well as rooms in the center, are available for rental.
