This community performance, sponsored by the Michigan 4H Youth programs of the Michigan State University Cooperative Extension Service, is one of six to be staged during the trouple's one month, 13 country tour. The troupe will put on 28 school performances.
These Michigan performances mark the first time the Chinese dance troupe has been to the United States.

After the dancers in their colorful costumes perform for their young noist, the dancers and children will have a chance to meet and visit. When the day ends and the children say to their new friends in Chinese, "until we meet again," they will have begun to acquire an understanding of the differences and similarities between us and our Chinese neighbors.






