

Police nab 4 suspects after chase

A dragnet ended with the capture of four teenagers after police chased a stolen car from Detroit to Farmington Saturday morning. The car's occupants hailed out on M-102, west of Farmington Road.

At 6 a.m. Saturday, Farmington police learned that Detroit police in a marked patrol car were chasing a stolen 1989 Pontiac Bonville west-bound on Grand River, then on M-

102. The chase ended west of Farmington Road near Fleming, where the car stopped abruptly and the four occupants ran toward Freedom Road. Two headed west on Freedom and two went north on Fleming. Officers from Farmington, Farmington Hills, Detroit and the Michigan State Police cordoned the Freedom-Fleming area and soon arrested a 16-year-old boy from Detroit, a 16-year-old boy from Toledo and a 13-year-old boy from Toledo.

Detroit police took custody of them and impounded the car, which had Ohio license plates.

DURING THE next two hours, police spotted the fourth teen at least four times. But each time, he eluded capture, using houses for cover and traveling through yards.

"It was almost a cat and mouse game," said Commander Thomas Cox of the Farmington Department of Public Safety.

"Several officers and citizens reported sightings," said Farmington

Hills police officer C.J. Rozum.

At 7:40 a.m., Rozum and Hills officer Wayne Beerbower saw the elusive suspect in the Cass-Fleming area.

They and other officers chased him around several houses before arresting him on James Court, east of Fleming. The 17-year-old Detroit was taken to the Farmington Jail, then turned over to Detroit police.

None of the suspects had a weapon nor resisted arrest once confronted, Cox said.

Bill would regulate tanning facilities

Legislation was introduced in the state Senate that which would regulate tanning facilities in Michigan. State Sen. Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, drafted the bill in response

to a constituent who wrote about the damage done to people who are unaware of the potential harm caused by overexposure to ultraviolet light. "The state has an obligation to be-

come involved when there is danger to the general population. We have here a situation where damage is already done," Faxon said.

The bill establishes standardized warning signs that must be posted and creates an enforcement mechanism.
