

Kaufman honoree at Israel Bond dinner

With "Moon Over Jerusalem" as its theme, the Tam O'Shanter Country Club in Orchard Lake will host its 17th annual Dinner Dance on behalf of State of Israel Bonds at 7 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 25. It was announced by dinner chairman Steven Zuck.

Honored at the event by his club and the State of Israel will be Alan Jay Kaufman, who will be presented with Israel's Jerusalem Award.

Kaufman, 41, is founder and senior partner of the law firm of Kaufman and Payton, with offices in Farmington Hills, Detroit, Grand Rapids and Traverse City.

The honoree is an active lecturer, writer and participant in the state and national legal arenas. He serves as chairman of the Detroit Bar Association's International Law Section and on many committees for the American Bar Association.

He is a longtime member of many civic and communal boards, including the Jewish Community Center, the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, Adat Shalom Synagogue, where he serves as chairman of its nursery school, the Detroit Service Group, the Michigan State Chamber of Commerce, the Detroit Institute of Arts Founders Junior Council, and the Fresh Air Society, where he serves as chairman of the Family Camp Committee.

Kaufman is also a member of the executive board of the Detroit Area Council of Boy Scouts of America, and a member of the Young Leader-

ship Cabinet of the United Jewish Appeal, the Israel Bond New Leadership Division, the Kelden Lodge of B'nai B'rith, the Perfection Lodge of the Masonic Order, the Detroit Club, and the Presidents Club of Michigan State University.

Kaufman is a former co-chairman of the allied Jewish Campaign's Lawyers Division and is now upgrade chairman of the campaign. He is also chairman of the Detroit Economic Club Life Membership Committee.

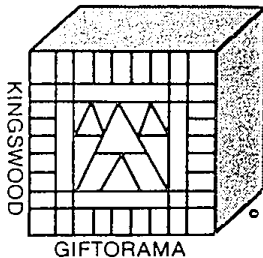

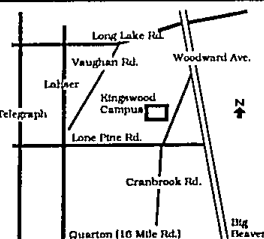
