A charge is it is to be preserved in the continued development, said Edward Husteles, director of planning for the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments. "Change means restricting development."

Adopting a master plan is complicated by the 60 separate units of city and township government within an individual development agenda that pits one community against the next. "We need a common vision that goes beyond individual communities. But do we have the political will to turn down development and loss property tax!"

get them is through intense use of the land." Perrick said.

The new mail, opposed by area residents who fear loss of quality life, is expected to provide \$6\$ million in taxes for Pontiac schools and \$6,000 new jobs, Tucker said.


