A man described as in his 20s, 6 feet tall and wearing a hooded jack-t, possibly an Army fatgue jacket, was seen knocking on nelghboring doors Sunday evening. Dec. 10. Police released a composite of the man and consider him a suspect, Pittsburgh detective William Hennigan said Tuesday.

Based on the condition of an upstairs bathroom where Farkas was found, Hennigan said it appeared there was "quite a struggle."

The house was ransacked and a VCR, CD player, telephone and camera were reported missing. Farkas car, a 1989 Acura, was found abandoned three miles away in a Pittsburgh suburb, police said.

FARKAS WENT to Pittsburgh in July to begin a three-year residency in the pediatries department of Children's Hospital. He was drawn to Pittsburgh by a host of relatives who live there, according to his father, Gerald of Jacksonwille, Fla. His mother, Connie, and sister, Beth, a Wayne State University graduate student, live in Farmington Hills.
Farkas graduated with distinction I June from Wayne State University School of Medicine.

He carned a bachelor of science degree in biology from the University of Michigan in 1985, graduating with distinction and class bonors. Before moving to Pittsburgh, Farkas was involved in various community activities, including work as a Special Olympics volunteer.

Farkas also is survived by a grandfather, Lawrence Farkas of Florida, as well as uncles, aunts and cousins in Fennsylvania and Florida. Rabbi Alvin Berkun of the Tree Life Congregation, Pittsburgh, offi-ciated at the funeral Wednesday. Burial was in Temple Brai Israel Cemetery, In nearby McKesport, Pa.

ailegedly smuggled marijuana from
South America to a residence in
Novi and a large farm near Howell.
At times, money from the conspiracy would fill sulteases and would be

From Michigan, the drug organization spread into soven other states in the Midwest and South, according to the indictment.




