Listed below are some of the Farmington Hills police and fire calls reported during the past week:

OFFICER HURT

A Farmington Hills police officer sought treatment after his patrol car was sideswiped during a traffic stop Sunday night.

Sgt. Gary Hawald was seated in his patrol car in the curb lane of Westbound Grand River, near Walworth, at 8:25 p.m. when a car sideswiped his driver's door and continued on.

The emergency lights of the semi-marked patrol car were on at the time, said Sgt. Ray Cranston, Farmington Hills Police Department Traffic Section supervisor.

A suspect, a 37-year-old Redford Township man, was stopped shortly after.

Hawald was treated at a local clinic for pain, Cranston said.

The car Hawald had originally stopped was not involved in the accident.

SMASH AND GRAB

The cash register was taken from the front counter during a smash and grab burglary at Happiness Is Flowers, 24579 Middlebelt, at 1 a.m. Sunday.

A cement block was thrown through the front door, causing \$500 in damage. The cash register was valued at \$400. It was not immediately known how much money it contained, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

MAN ASSAULTED

A 37-year-old man told Farmington Hills police he was assaulted by another patron at 7-Eleven, 29318 Orchard Lake, Friday night.

According to a Farmington Hills police report, the man was pushed by another patron inside the convenience store. Shoving followed.

Two companions of the second man then entered the store. They held the Farmington Hills man by his arms while the second man put his knee to the man's eye.

CAR SWAP

Two men cruising the parking lot of Paul Inman & Associates, 38055 Northwestern Highway, abandoned a stolen car and took a 1987 Chevrolet Camaro belonging to an employee Saturday morning.

The recovered car, a 1990 Chevrolet Blazer, had been stolen from Southfield. When recovered, the engine was on and the steering column was damaged.

The Camaro IROC Z-28 was valued at \$14,000, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

OPEN AFTER HOURS

Farmington Hills police said they will report Shop's Tavern, 30859 10 Mile, to the Michigan Liquor Control Commission for staying open past the 2 a.m. closing time Dec. 8.

The tavern was still open when police came by at 3:10 a.m. Three patrons and the bartender were inside, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

HOUSE FIRE

Damage was estimated at \$5,500 as a result of a chimney fire in a house on Linden Sunday night.

Fire was found behind the fireplace wall with some extension to the second floor. Exterior siding also was removed to reach the fire, according to a Farmington Hills fire report.

CASH DRAWER FOUND

A DPW worker found a cash register drawer filled with leaves and water, but no money, in a drainage ditch at Freedom and Fleming Dec. 8, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.

MAN FLEES

A man who tried his way into a residence at Foxpoint Townhouses, 26375 Halsted, Friday morning left within moments of breaking in. The homeowner told Farmington Hills police.

The woman told police she heard a car drive up at 11:45 a.m. She saw the driver park, stay seated for a while, then get out and go to the truck, where he retrieved a crowbar, which he put under his jacket. He then approached her townhouse, first the front door, then the doorwall, which he pried open. After entering the townhouse, he soon left and drove away. Nothing appeared missing.

Damage to the doorwall was estimated at \$50.

TRAFFIC ALTERCATION

A motorist pulled alongside another

motorist on M-102 and tossed a coffee mug at her car during a traffic altercation Sunday afternoon.

According to a Farmington Hills police report:

A 24-year-old Farmington Hills woman was eastbound on M-102 when a van came up behind her car. The driver flashed his lights and tailgated her.

At Grand River, he pulled alongside the driver's side of her car, yelled obscenities and threw a glass coffee mug through his lowered passenger window. The mug dented the hood of the woman's car before falling to the ground and shattering.

Damage was estimated at more than \$100.

YOUTH DETAINED

Farmington Hills police will seek juvenile court petitions charging a 15-year-old Detroit youth with violating curfew and possessing marijuana after he was seen walking on Grand River at Truck at 12:45 a.m. Monday.

He was apparently headed to the nearby Putt-Putt Golf & Games. He was turned over to his mother pending petitions, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

BEER DISCOVERED

Police ticketed a 20-year-old Farmington Hills woman and a 24-year-old Waterford woman when open cans of beer were found in their

car during a traffic stop in Farmington Hills Sunday. The 20-year-old was ticketed for possessing alcohol. The 24-year-old was ticketed for transporting open intoxicants in a motor vehicle, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

Police ticketed a 18-year-old Farmington Hills man and a 17-year-old Birmingham woman when open bottles of beer were found in their car during a traffic stop in Farmington Hills Sunday. Both were ticketed for possessing alcohol, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

STRING OF DAMAGE

At least three property damage incidents occurred in or around the Bel Aire subdivision this past weekend, according to Farmington Department of Public Safety reports.
