Buses leave designated sites at 4:30 p.m. and return approximately at 10 p.m. The first session will be January 5, 12 and 19. Fee is \$45 and includes ticket, lesson and transportation. Ski rental is not included.

● SKI TRIP

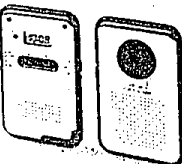
