

# Shumate topples meet record

Northville's first-place showing in the Belleville Invitational overshadowed a pair of outstanding individual efforts by Observatory swimmers Saturday.

Troy Shumate of runner-up Redford Catholic and Ron Orris of third-place Plymouth Salem won two events apiece and helped a relay team to a high finish.

The two teams had 308 points, the Shamrocks 302 and the Rocks 290. The short school was last in the four-team meet with 238 points.

Shumate shattered a meet record in the 200-yard freestyle with a 1:49.35 time. The old mark was 1:53.45 set last year by former Salem swimmer Mike Hill. He also won the butterfly in 55.11 and just missed the record in the event by .07.

Shumate also anchored the Shamrocks' second-place freestyle relay team. Alan Afarsi, John Bro-

gan, Brian Dynda and Shumate finished in 3:27.69.

ORRIS WON the 50 freestyle in 21.73 and the 100 freestyle in 47.28. The Rocks were third in the freestyle relay with Orris swimming the anchor leg. Joe Pawluska, Brett Melk, Craig Wilsher and Orris went 3:37.69.

In addition to Shumate, CC had other first-place swimmers in Mike Hoeftlein, Randy Teeters and the medley relay team.

Hoeftlein set a record in the backstroke, which he won in 58.22. Brian Bogard set the former mark of 59.90 while swimming for Belleville last year.

Hoeftlein and Teeters also combined with Brogan and Dave West to win the medley relay in 1:49.39. Teeters won the breaststroke in 1:05.89, missing the meet record by .80.

Teeters and Hoeftlein also contributed a pair of

second places. Teeters finished the individual medley in 2:08.39 and Hoeftlein the 100 freestyle in 51.17.

Dynda was third in the 500 freestyle (5:27.16) and fourth in the 200 (1:53.39). Afarsi was third in the 100 freestyle (52.66) and Brogan was fourth in the 50 freestyle (24.08).

OTHER THAN Orris' individual wins, the only additional top-three finish for Salem was the medley relay team's second-place effort. Eric Bunch, Mark Jackson, Albert Sneath and Chris Calofa put together a 3:37.69.

Bogard also was fourth in the IM (2:16.55) as was Bryan Keppen in the backstroke (1:11.59).

Salem's best in other events came from Wilsher, 200 freestyle, seventh; Colain, 50 freestyle, sixth; Calioa, 100 freestyle, fifth; Wilsher, 500 freestyle, fifth; Curt Witthoff, backstroke, fifth; and Matt Wisniewski, breaststroke, sixth.

WLAA, could have a team suited for the big meets.

"Our goal is to be among the top 10 in the state, because we have a few more swimmers," he said. "We are very strong in diving and have some swimmers who are going to go there and do well."

Harrison placed 10th in Class B two years ago and scored only diving points last year.

"This year is going to be a different story," Leonhardt said.

Diving will play a major role in any Harrison success. Carl Johnson, one of five seniors, was 12th in the state as a sophomore and seventh last year.

"His goal is to win the state meet in Class B," Leonhardt said.

In addition to Johnson, who was fifth in the WLAA, the Hawks have

junior Ryan Koonce, who was 12th in the state.

The other seniors are Chad Hughes, Jeff Sklar, Ed Serzo and Jeff Hurley. Hughes, Sklar and Hurley are sprint freestylers, but Hughes and Sklar also are fliers. Serzo's specialty is the backstroke.

"We are a pretty good swimming team," Leonhardt said. "It's hard

when you have 10 returning people and two are divers. Basically, all we have are eight swimmers."

The other returnees are juniors Jason Barringer, Jayson Schwalm, Ryan Osterbeck and Sean Levine. Barringer was fifth in the WLAA as a backstroker, while Osterbeck and Levine are sprint freestylers. Levine is an all-purpose swimmer.

"Barringer and Serzo made state cuts but didn't score at the state meet," Leonhardt said. "We're looking for them to score this year, and we're also looking for the medley relay to do real well at the end of the year."

Freestyle is the only open spot on the medley. Serzo (back), Barringer (breast) and Hughes (fly) are the constants with either Schwalm or Hurley likely to be the freestyler.

"I've got a lot of people forward to the season," Leonhardt said, "because it will be a challenge on my part coaching a team that is so inexperienced. But it's going to be fun."

# Victory eludes upstart Eagles

Already St. Mary's basketball team has proven to be a bit tougher than many may have thought before the season. After all, 10 of 14 Eagles are freshmen or sophomores — a ratio that rarely breeds success.

But they have beaten the odds.

Victories over Oakland University and Hillsdale College testify to that. However, with a bit more

good fortune or concentration or intelligence down the stretch in close games — a combination of which St. Mary's coach Glen Donahue would collectively call "making the big plays" — the Eagles' record would be better than 7-5.

Making the proper plays when needed proved pivotal Saturday at Dombrowski Fieldhouse. St. Mary's was up 10 in the first half, with 3½ minutes left in the game, was up 80-75 over NCAA Division III powerhouse Calvin College. But the visiting Knights battled back to win, 92-87.
