Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week:

2 CHARGED

Two Macomb County men face misdemeanor charges after Farmington Hills police approached a suspicious car parked in the front lot of the Orchard-14 Shopping Center at 10 p.m. Saturday.

A 20-year-old Warren man and a 22-year-old Sterling Heights man are charged with consuming alcohol (beer) on property open to the public. The Warren man also is charged with possessing drug paraphernalia (a marijuana pipe with residue).

Conviction of either charge could bring a penalty of up to 90 days in jail.

The two men face possible felony charges and personal property forfeiture if lab tests come back positive on a suspected controlled substance found when officer Craig Hurt confronted them, detective Doug Anderson said.

FALSE ID

A 21-year-old Drayton Plains man was ticketed for furnishing false ID to a liquor establishment when he presented someone else's driver's license at the door of Mr. Sports One of a Kind, 3060 Orchard Lake Road, Saturday night, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

LOUD PARTY

An 18-year-old man was ticketed on a disorderly party complaint when officers responding to a New Year's party on Kings Point Court at 12:30 a.m. Monday had to break up two fights involving the same group of people, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

WINDOWS DAMAGED

Damage was estimated at \$2,000 when 13 house or car windows were shot at or broken out in Farmington Hills between 3 p.m. Sunday and noon Monday.

A pellet was fired through the dining room window of a house on Fox Creek, a window of a car stuck in a ditch on Halsted near M-102, and windows of cars parked in front of houses on Windwood, Riverbend, Baywood, Shadow Glen and Fox Creek.

Pellets also were fired through windows of two vehicles parked at the Knights Inn, 37527 Grand River, and a window of a van parked at the Radisson Suites Hotel, 37529 Grand River.

An unknown object was used to break out a window of a car parked in front of a house on Vacri and a window in each of two cars parked in front of houses on Windwood, according to Farmington Hills police reports.

ALCOHOL SEIZED

Two 20-year-old men were ticketed for possessing alcohol when champagne and beer were found in their car at a traffic stop at 14 Mile and Orchard Lake Road at 4 p.m. Sunday. The alcohol was seized, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

Man faces assault charge

A 31-year-old woman told Farmington Hills police she played dead to stop her enraged husband from smothering her in their apartment after an argument Sunday afternoon. Ainslie Woodward, 31, pleaded not guilty to a charge of assault with intent to murder at his arraignment Tuesday before Magistrate James Brady of Farmington. He faces up to life in prison if convicted. Bond was set at \$5,000. A preliminary exam in 47th District Court is set for next Monday.

The woman suffered a welt and cut on her neck and a bump on her head, police said.

Police said they responded to other domestic disputes at the apartment on Glen Court at Fairmont Park Apartments last year. The residents, married three years, have lived there for one year.

The victim told police an argument escalated about 3 p.m. Sunday. She said she was grabbed and choked, but managed to break free.

Moments later, in another room, she was grabbed and thrown to the floor, and her face was covered with a robe and bedsheet. Fearing for her life, she stopped resisting and played dead.

When her attacker loosened his hold, she ran, although dizzy, to a neighbor's.

Police arrested the suspect in her apartment soon after.

Farmington Square Apartments resident who tried to detain three teenagers who damaged a building window Sunday.

Hearing commotion at 6:30 p.m., the 35-year-old man went downstairs to investigate. He saw three teenagers kicking out a window. When they saw him, they ran downstairs and he followed.

As he rounded a corner, he saw one pointing a long gun in his direction. He then heard what appeared to be a gunshot and heard something hit the window behind him.

The three teens then ran into an

apartment and out the doorway. The man caught one but the teen soon broke free and ran to a car where his two companions were waiting.

Damage to the window was estimated at \$250, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

CAR ATTACKED

A 1983 Datsun 280ZX sustained about \$2,000 in damage when a group of teenagers kicked and tossed beer cans at it during an incident in the parking lot of the Kolbus Inn, 37527 Grand River, at 9:30 p.m. Sunday.

The 17-year-old driver, from Franklin, and his 15-year-old passenger, from Birmingham, told officers they drove into the lot to meet a friend when a pickup approached. The truck contained about 12 teenagers.

A conversation followed during which the 17-year-old, still in his car, was kicked in the face. The car was then attacked, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

WALLET RECOVERED

A Community EMS paramedic recovered her wallet moments after a

just-released patient removed it from her parked ambulance outside the emergency room at Botsford General Hospital, 28050 Grand River, Monday.

As the paramedic was leaving the hospital at 2:55 a.m., she spotted a man outside her ambulance, holding her wallet. She yelled and he stopped. She then grabbed her wallet as he fled on foot.

The unidentified man, brought in by another ambulance, had just been released from the emergency room after treatment for a head injury,

according to a Farmington Hills police report.

WOMAN BEATEN

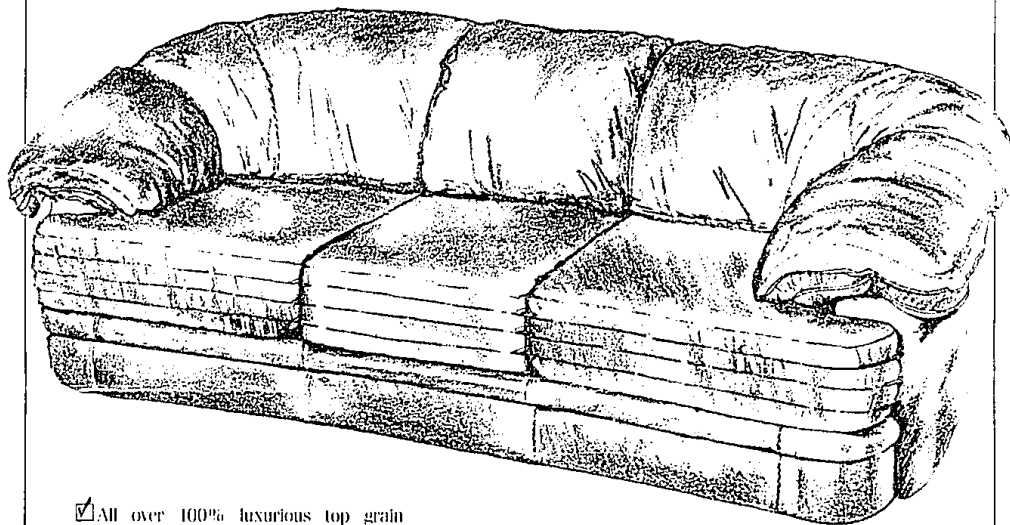
