

Vagnozzi Heads To New Term

Aldo Vagnozzi of Farmington will continue to reign as chairman of the Oakland County portion of the 19th Congressional District Democratic organization. He was unofficially elected when that district in spring convention named him convention chairman without opposition.

Vagnozzi is expected to get the nod as permanent chairman of the total district, which includes a portion of Wayne County, when delegates meet in state convention on Saturday, Feb. 13 in Grand Rapids.

Oakland 19th Dems deferred election of 1971-72 district officers to that caucus, unlike those of the Wayne 19th who elected Redford Township Supervisor Bill Robbins chairman of their portion in a separate county-district convention. Robbins will serve under the man selected by the total district, who must be from Oakland county by state law.

Vagnozzi has no announced opposition.

ALL DEMOCRATS with paid up dues for 1970 or those paid for 1971 by Saturday Jan. 16, and living within the 19th District will be eligible delegates to the state convention in Grand Rapids Feb. 13-14, according to the decision of the Oakland 19th spring district convention.

Those desiring to attend should register with Vagnozzi.

State convention delegates will cast proportionate votes for the district's 93 convention votes.

Oakland 19th Dems blitzed through their district convention, unhampered by sticky ballots and greased by pre-convention committees who had recommendations printed and ready at the beginning.

THIS helped avoid the normally time consuming committee meetings and has led to clarify verbal reports. Factionalism is becoming

extremely rare in the Oakland 19th, and was totally absent from this convention. The largest contingent by far to a generally poorly attended convention was that of the Pontiac area, which has occasionally challenged suburban and rural groups.

Vagnozzi, despite being a union functionary as editor of the AFL-CIO News in a period of increasing criticism of union orientation of the Democratic Party, testifies not only to continued union membership strength but also personal diplomatic ability.

After long contention with Wayne 19th opposition, he has in fact been able to achieve a real measure of solidarity there, too.

"I WAS PLEASED with the selection of Robbins," Vagnozzi told Observer Newspapers. "I was involved along with the elected officials in getting the factions together. They (the elected officials) played a role they haven't played in the past."

Vagnozzi specified: State Rep. John Bennett of Redford Township, State Rep. Marvin Stempion of Livonia, newly-elected State Sen. David Plawewski of Dearborn Heights

representing Redford, and Wayne County Commissioners Richard Manning of Redford Township and John McCann of Livonia as active in this "new" leadership role. Vagnozzi cautioned that after congressional reapportionment, "chances are the Wayne 19th won't be lumped with Oakland" and will need to be ready to take on new organizational leadership. "They ought not be divided at this point," quipped Vagnozzi.
