About Farley, Police Chief William Dwyer said: "In his five years, he has distinguished himself as an individual who can be counted on by fellow officers in difficult situations."

In the past year, Farley earned a valor citation for his handling of a life-threatening situation involving an armed robbery suspect and other awards for outstanding police actions. He also is a field training officer.

Farley is "probably the most highly respected officer in the Farmington Hills Police Department," Dwyer said.

THE FIREFIGHTER of the year award recognizes outstanding contributions made above and beyond the call of duty on behalf of residents and which improve the overall performance of the fire department.

About St. Clair, Fire Chief Richard Marinucci said: "Probably the most significant impact this individual has had on the community and the department has been in the area of public fire education. He has provided public fire education for a variety of audiences and businesses."

St. Clair has been a firefighter for 10 years, the past two full time. He is a certified fire service instructor and inspector. He's popular among kids learning about fire safety and is founder of the department's clown corps.

Last year, he and firefighter Wally Kurzeja used an automatic defibrillator to revive a 20-year-old woman who had been electrocuted in an on-the-job accident.
