Farmington faces 10 percent hikes

When Farmington residents get annual assessment notices in mid-February, their property will likely be worth more.

That means higher property taxes for 1990.

As in other cities throughout oakland County, residents of Farmington have watched their properties increase in value steadily over the past several years. City assessor John Saller said last week residential values have increased, and the average, slightly more this year than in 1989.

"It's been the city has completed its residential property analysis and is in the midst of completing commer-rial and industrial property assessments in the city, he said.

THE OAKLAND County Equal-

ization Division last week released suggested average increases for each community, including a 10 percent increase for the city of Farmington. That compares with a 7, percent suggested average increase countywide. Last year, residential increases in Farmington averaged 9 percent. Some properties, including a few condominium developments in the city, will see increases as low as 5 percent, while certain subdivisions may see increases as link as 14 percent, Salter said.

Assessment increuses are based on real estate sales during a 24-month period ending last March. Increases throughout the county show a continued, strong market.

After Farmington residents receive assessment notices, they will have the right to appeal through the Board of Review process.
