

police/fire calls

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week:

● tickets issued

Four Farmington Hills teenagers were ticketed for possessing alcohol during a traffic stop at Lamar and Springbrook Friday night.

The four, ages 17-18, were found possessing wine cooler and schnapps, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

● cocaine suspected

A 28-year-old Detroit man faces charges of driving with a suspended license and possessing suspected cocaine following a traffic stop at Northwestern Highway and Inkster Friday night.

After he was arrested because of outstanding felony warrants in Detroit and West Bloomfield on concealed weapon and bad check charges, officers found an envelope of suspected cocaine and a short-staw with suspected cocaine residue in his possession during booking at the Farmington Hills Jail, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

● woman stabbed

Farmington Hills police turned over a 34-year-old Detroit man to Detroit police in connection with a stabbing at a house party in Detroit Friday night.

A 27-year-old Detroit woman told Farmington Hills police at Botsford General Hospital that she was stabbed in the lower back and beaten during an argument at a house party on Rockdale.

Farmington Hills police arrested the suspect at a doughnut shop near

Botsford. He and another man had driven the woman to the hospital. The woman was admitted for treatment of a stab wound and a swollen eye, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

● house fire

Damage was estimated at \$8,000 when a closet fire broke out in a 1-story house on Wheeler Sunday afternoon.

No one was hurt in the 3 p.m. fire. The cause continues to be investigated, according to a Farmington Hills fire report.

● apartment fire

A stove fire left about \$1,000 in damage to an apartment on the 29300 block of 12 Mile Sunday night.

The fire developed when the resident momentarily left what was cooking unattended to answer the phone. A neighbor extinguished the fire with a dry chemical extinguisher.

The fire was confined to the kitchen, according to a Farmington Hills fire report.

● exam waived

Two Detroit men and a Southfield woman waived their right to a preliminary exam Monday and were bound over for trial on assault and conspiracy charges in a shooting incident in which the Farmington Hills home of a 25-year-old man was sprayed with gunfire Jan. 14.

District Judge Margaret Schaefer of Farmington bound over for trial Robert Larry Jaber, 19, and Gary Robert Meldrum, 23, both of Detroit, and Maria Victoria Knes, 19, of Southfield.

The three will be arraigned before

Oakland County Circuit Judge Robert Templin Feb. 6.

A fourth suspect, James Scott Meldrum, 21, of Detroit, did not have an attorney present Monday so his preliminary exam was postponed until Friday.

All are being held in the Oakland County Jail in lieu of high cash bonds. Magistrate James Brady entered not-guilty pleas in their behalf on Jan. 15.

Jaber faces six counts and Gary Meldrum four counts — including assault with intent to murder. James

Meldrum and Knes faces two counts — including conspiracy to do great bodily harm.

Investigators believe the shooting may have stemmed from a dispute between the 25-year-old man and his brother's ex-girlfriend.

Police aren't saying if the suspects knew anyone was inside the darkened, one-story house when the shooting started at 3:35 a.m. Jan. 14 on Inkster, just north of Eight Mile.

Five, small-caliber bullets hit the front of the house and entered a bedroom, police said.

● suspected drugs

Officers investigating a suspicious car parked at Botsford Terrace Apartments on Independence early Tuesday confiscated drug paraphernalia and suspected cocaine and marijuana residue from an 18-year-old Westland man and a 22-year-old Farmington Hills man, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

● thefts reported

A pair of skis, boots and poles valued at \$534 were reported stolen from a garage on the 28000 block of

Farmington Road, Farmington Hills, Jan. 19-21.

U.S. flags valued at \$85 each were reported stolen from flagpoles in Farmington Hills' Heritage and Pioneer parks on Farmington Road Jan. 19-22.

A 1982 Chevrolet Corvette valued at \$11,000 was reported stolen from the driveway of a house on Branchester, Farmington Hills, Jan. 22.

A VCR was reported stolen from a house on Jacksonville, Farmington Hills, Jan. 22.

Suspect in burglaries arrested

A 19-year-old man who lives in the Olde Town area of southeast Farmington Hills is a suspect in as many as 13 residential burglaries in that neighborhood since Jan. 1, police said.

Mostly VCRs were stolen over the two-week period between Jan. 1-14, police said.

William Henry Campbell V was arraigned Jan. 16 before District

Judge Fred Harris of Farmington and stood mute to five counts of breaking and entering of an occupied dwelling with intent to commit larceny. A not-guilty plea was entered in the suspect's behalf.

Harris set cash or surety bond at \$25,000 pending a preliminary exam in 47th District Court this week. The defendant faces up to 15 years in prison if convicted.

Campbell is a suspect in eight other residential break-ins in the same area during the same time but no warrants have been issued in those cases, Murphy said.

Undercover police arrested Campbell at 8:20 p.m. Sunday, Jan. 14.

Murphy gave the following account of what preceded the arrest: Earlier that night, Olde Town residents alerted police to a man acting

suspicious. Patrol officers identified him and where to look.

Detectives, assisted by undercover officers, set up a surveillance. Eventually, they saw the man walk up to a house and later leave, carrying an object in a bag.

After checking the house and finding entry had been made through a basement window, officers arrested the suspect.
