A new ice rink has been constructed for this season by the comfort station adjacent to the back parking lot. This rink is designated for ice hockey play. The farm pond near the Spicer House

parking lot is to be used for ice skating only. The park is open down to dusk.

## Drivers workshop slated

Drivers older than 50 may participate in a workshop designed to help them improve their driving skills, increase their confidence, maintain their driving independence and possibly qualify them for multi-year discounts on automobile insurance premiums.

The senior driver retraining workshop will be held Feb. 22-23, between 9:30 a.m. and 2 p.m., at the Farmington Community School, 30415 Shinwassee Road, Farmington Hills.

More than 700 mature drivers have already completed the workshop, which includes American Association of Retired Persons "55 Alive/Mature Driving," as well as the opportunity for skills self-assessment and a behind-the-wheel driving exercise.

No records of scores are maintained and results have no bearing on a driver's license. The goal is simply to help senior citizens continue to drive for as long and as safely as

possible.

The workshop is hosted by Farmington Community School and presented by the Traffic Improvement Association of Oakland County under a federal grant received through the Michigan Office of Highway Safety Planning.

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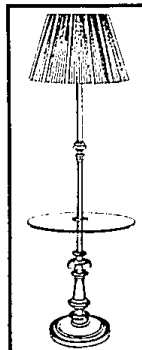
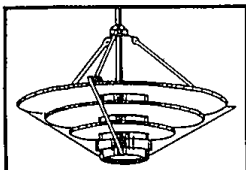

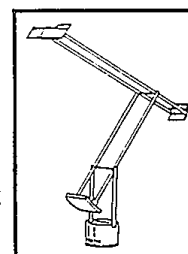
