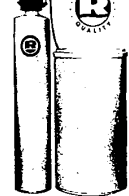

The financial effects of recent legislation and developments in Lansing on the Farmington School District will be discussed at the next

meeting of the Farmington Area Council of PTAs. The meeting will be held Monday, Feb. 1, at 8 p.m. in Farmington Junior High's library, announced Mrs. Robert Allen, legislative chairman for the council.

William Prisk, Farmington School District business manager, will report on financial cutbacks and how Public Act 100 will affect the district. Other topics to be discussed will be: The Family Life Education committee reports and how they will be implemented in the public schools; public hearings planned by the State Board of Education; role of the local PTA council delegate; and what the local PTA should expect from its legislative chairman.
